LR Agenda Item 1:

PASSED

Long Range Marksman Program - points

Current rule:

There is nothing in the rule book currently

Reason and description of proposed change:

Even though there is nothing in the rule book for the Long Range Marksman (LRM) program, this has been a life time achievement award and points have been given on the same basis as the Shooter of the Year program in the past. This was inadvertently left out of the rule book a number of years ago. The new proposed point system is strictly for the LRM program and not the Shooter of the Year program, the two awards are different programs. The proposed system will award points based on the number of shooters beaten during a relay and match.

The following rule(s) changes have been proposed:

J) 1000 Yard Competition-

*7) LONG RANGE MARKSMAN AWARDS AND RECOGNITION
IBS sanctioned 1000 yard competition only.*

a. IBS 1000 Yard Long Range Marksman awards will be based solely on points accumulated in 1000 yard registered IBS benchrest matches.

- 1) IBS registered match must have 2 or more competitors.
- 2) The total number of shooters in a class will be divided as evenly as possible into relays.
- 3) In the case where there is only one relay the winner of that relay must shoot another target that would be scored as there shoot off target.
- 4) It is the responsibility of the individual 1000 yard clubs to submit a schedule of points awarded to each shooter (relay and match) per

match to the Long Range committee which will designate one individual to be **Keeper of the Points** who will submit a report to all shooters of the results periodically during the year.

5) Class relay winners .05 points for every IBS shooter in the relay.

6) Class shoot-off winner .03 points for every IBS competitor in the class.

7) IBS National Championship

(a) Two gun

1st place .03 points per IBS shooter registered

2nd place .02 points per IBS registered

3rd – 5th place .01 point per IBS shooter registered

(b) Overall light and heavy gun classes

1st place .025 points per IBS shooter registered.

2nd place .015 points per IBS shooter registered.

3rd – 5th place .01 point per IBS shooter registered.

(c) Individual classes (light/heavy score and group)

1st place .025 points per IBS shooter registered.

2nd place .015 points per IBS shooter registered.

3rd – 5th place .01 point per IBS shooter registered.

(d) IBS records

Group or score - 4 points

Aggregate records – 4 points

(a) Six and ten match aggregate records will

be based solely on the first 10 IBS

sanctioned matches of the year per club

(relay targets only).

(e) There is no limit as to the number of clubs a shooter may accumulate LRM points at during the year

LR Agenda Item 2:

Long Range Marksman Program - Awards

Current rule:

There is nothing in the rule book currently

Reason and description of proposed change:

Even though there is nothing in the rule book for the Long Range Marksman (LRM) program, this has been a life time achievement award and points have been given on the same basis as the Shooter of

the Year program in the past. This was inadvertently left out of the rule book a number of years ago. The new proposed awards are strictly for the LRM program and not the Shooter of the Year program, the two are different programs. The proposal will give awards for life time achievements beyond the current gold awards.

The following rule(s) changes have been proposed:

The Long Range Marksman Awards will be as follows:

- 1) 30 LRM points – Bronze - shooter is awarded a Jacket.*
- 2) 60 LRM points – Silver - Shooter is awarded a Silver logo and a plaque*
- 3) 100 LRM points – Gold – Shooter is awarded a Gold logo and a Plaque*
- 4) 130 LRM points – a Star is added to the Bronze logo and a Plaque*
- 5) 160 LRM points – a Star is added to the Silver Logo and a Plaque*
- 6) 190 LRM points – a Star is added to the Gold logo and a Plaque*
- 7) 200 LRM points – Platinum logo and a Plaque*

LR Agenda Item 3:

REJECTED

Definition of a Relay

Current rule:

*J) 1000 yard Completion- 1) course of fire – Heavy Gun
a. Competitors are assigned to relays. Group size and score winners from each relay will compete in respective Shoot-Offs to determine the overall match winners. If a competitor has both the smallest group and highest score in a relay, the smallest group will take precedent, and the competitor with the next highest score will advance to the score Shoot Off.*

Reason and description of proposed change:

This proposal would allow the individual 1000 yard clubs to determine the number of relay targets to be shot and aggregated in a match to determine the shooters that would advance to the shoot offs. This would give the shooters of a club potentially more shooting and allow clubs

currently not affiliated with the IBS to affiliate with the IBS and shoot the IBS format in addition to their clubs current affiliation format.

The following rule(s) changes have been proposed:

a. Competitors are assigned to relays. A relay shall consist of a one, two, or three target aggregate, number of targets to be shot for a relay will be determined by the individual Clubs, submitted with their Match contract and approved by the IBS Match Schedule Chairman before the start of their season. Points awarded under the individual Long Range Marksman and Shooter of the Year programs would be the same irregardless of the number of targets shot in a relay. Six and Ten Match aggregates for IBS records would be based solely on the first target shot in a relay. Group size and score winners from each relay will compete in respective Shoot-Offs to determine the overall match winners. If a competitor has both the smallest group and highest score in a relay, the smallest group will take precedent, and the competitor with the next highest score will advance to the score Shoot Off.

Reason and description of proposed change:

The new proposed points system would award Shooter of the Year points based on the number of shooters beaten on a relay and the total number of shooters beaten in a class for the Match. It is believed this is a fairer system of awarding points for Relay and match wins where as the current system has only two point breaks, 20 shooters are needed to hold a match points are the same from 20 shooters through 49 and additional point is awarded for shooters in excess of 50 for match wins. The current point system is the same for relay wins irregardless of the number of shooters on a relay. Under the proposed system Shooter of the Year points will awarded at a match with 2 or more shooters verses the old 20 or more shooters.

The following rule(s) changes have been proposed:

J) 1000 Yard Competition-

5) IBS Awards and Recognition

a. IBS 1000 yard Shooter of the Year (SOY) honors will be based solely on the points accumulated at the first 10 sanctioned IBS 1000 yard matches per IBS 1000 yard club per year. There is no limit as to the number of clubs a shooter may accumulate SOY points at, as long as they are the first 10 matches sanctioned by the IBS per club during the calendar year.

b. 1000 yard Shooter of the Year Program

- 1) IBS registered match must have 2 or more competitors.**
- 2) IBS 1000 yard Shooter of the Year (SOY) honors will be based solely on the points accumulated at the first 10 sanctioned IBS 1000 yard matches per IBS 1000 yard club per year. There is no limit as to the number of clubs a shooter may accumulate SOY points at, as long as**

they are the first 10 matches sanctioned by the IBS per club during the calendar year.

3) The total number of shooters in a class will be divided as evenly as possible into relays.

4) In the case where there is only one relay the winner of that relay must shoot another target that would be scored as there shoot off target.

5) It is the responsibility of the individual 1000 yard clubs to submit a schedule of points awarded to each shooter (relay and match) per match for SOY. The Long Range committee which will designate one individual to be Keeper of the Points who will submit a report of results to all shooters periodically during the year.

6) Class relay winners .05 points for every IBS shooter in the relay.

7) Class shoot-off winner .03 points for every IBS competitor in the class.

(e) Two gun

1st place .03 points per IBS shooter registered

2nd place .02 points per IBS registered

3rd – 5th place .01 point per IBS shooter registered

(f) Overall light and heavy gun classes

1st place .025 points per IBS shooter registered.

2nd place .015 points per IBS shooter registered.

(a) Six and ten match aggregate records will be based solely on the first 10 IBS sanctioned matches of the year per club (relay targets only). The six match aggregates will be determined by the best 6 group and score targets out of the first 10 IBS sanctioned matches of the year per club (relay targets only). A shooter may have six and ten match. Aggregates at each IBS 1000 yard club.

LR Agenda Item 7: Score tie breaker –

PASSED

Current rule:

LONG RANGE COMPETITION E 20) In case of a tie for any award in an individual match, winners are determined as follows: in any case of a tie for score, the smallest group of the two targets will determine the winner. In the case of a tie for the smallest group, the higher score determines the winner. In case of a tie for the smallest group, and score is also tied, the bullet nearest to the center of the bull's-eye determines the winner. In the case of a tie for score, and group size in the same as well, the bullet hole nearest to the center of the bull's-eye determines the winner.

Reason and description of proposed change:

Proposed change to the current 1000 yard Benchrest score tie breaker rule which uses group size as the first tie breaker.

It is my contention that group size is secondary and contradictory to establishing a winning score target and should not be the first choice for a tie breaker. In view of that I suggest the current rule be revised to use X count as the first tie breaker. Should that fail to establish a clear cut winner then and only then will group size can be used to finally determine the winner. In the very unlikely instance that the previous methods fail to establish a clear cut winner closest to center would be the final criteria used to establish a winner. To establish the winner for score at any long range match the following procedure must be followed. Total numerical value will be established by totaling the value of each shot in accordance to its location in the scoring rings. The highest point value is declared the winner for score. Should that value be the same as another shooter(s) the number of X's will be totaled for each target and the target with the most Xs will be awarded the win. Should the targets still have equal value the smallest group size as measured and established by the official scorers will be the declared winner. Should there still be a tie the final criteria will be the target with the shot closest to the center of the target which is represented by the X in the center of the X Ring. If the above methods fail to establish a winner the shooters of the targets will be awarded relay points and wins thereby advancing to the shoot offs. If this occurs in a shoot off and reshoot should be declared

The following rule(s) changes have been proposed:

In case of a tie for any award in an individual match, winners are determined as follows: in any case of a tie for score, the number shots in the X ring will be totaled and the target with the most X's will determine the winner. In the case of a tie for score and the X ring count, the smallest group will determine the winner. If there is still a tie for score the target with the closest shot to the center of the target which is represented by the X in the center of the X ring, will determine the winner. In the case of a tie for the smallest group, the higher score determines the winner. In case of a tie for the smallest group, and score is also tied, the bullet nearest to the center of the bull's-eye determines the winner.

LR Agenda Item #8:

Shooter of the Year Program

A.

If this agenda item is passed it will go into effect for the 2007 shooting season and will be for a one year trial period.

Reason and description of the proposed change:

The purpose of this proposal is to make the points at the National Championship more uniform.. Instead of 1st place getting a lot of points and 2nd place getting just a few this would even things out more. For instance 10th place should not get as many points as 2nd place in the individual classes.

Shooter of the Year Program

If this agenda item is passed it will go into effect for the 2007 shooting season and will be for a one year trial period.

Reason and description of the proposed change:

The purpose of this proposal is to put more emphasis on the relay. A shooter shoots against a larger number of shooters in the relay than he does in the shootoffs. This would make it more fair for a shooter who wins relays but not shootoffs to accumulate points towards his Shooter of the Year awards.

The following rule change has been proposed:

VII) Long Range Competition

D) 1000 Yard Competition

4) IBS AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

IBS sanctioned 1000 Yard competition only.

a. IBS 1000 Yard Shooter of the Year honors will be based solely on points accumulated in the 10 sanctioned aggregate 1000 Yard matches at each club, the National Championships, and records.

(a) In case of a tie for the Shooter of the Year points the winners are determined

Using the following criteria:#1- Total number of shoot-off wins,
#2- Number

Of relay wins, #3- Season group aggregate, #4- Season score aggregate.

b. IBS sanctioned match(20 or more competitors)

(a) The number of shooters in a class will be divided as evenly as possible into relays.

(b) Class Shoot-off winner : 0.5 points (20 to 49 shooters)

1 point (50 or more shooters)

(c) Class Relay winner : 0.1 point for every IBS shooter in the relay

Proposed By-Law For the IBS

Rule as currently written:

Directors

Article XIV

Score Committee

Section 1.

The Score Committee shall consist minimum of three(3) and a maximum of six (6) individual members nominated and elected by a majority vote of the Hunter rifle competitors at the Annual Meeting.

Reason for rule change:

The current bylaws allow for only the Hunter rifles competitors present at the annual meeting to nominate and vote on Score Committee members. The Score Committee

represents both Hunter and Varmint for Score competitors and the rules need to be changed to reflect that ALL score shooters have a choice as to who is nominated and voted on for the Score Committee at the annual meeting.

Proposed change to rules:

In the bylaws, under directors Article XIV Score Committee Section 1, change the words “Hunter Competitors” to read “Score Competitors”.

The Score Committee recommends this by-law change.

VII. Score Shooting

C. Rifle-Hunter and Varmint Hunter

8.A magazine shall be capable of holding two or more loaded rounds of ammunition. The action will have a magazine cut in its bottom and the magazine shall be capable of holding two or more loaded rounds of ammunition for which the rifle barrel is chambered.

Strike” *A magazine shall be capable of holding two or more loaded rounds of ammunition*”

Add the balance of the text to more clearly define a hunter action and the type of ammunition it must be able to hold within its magazine.

The Score Committee recommends this rule change.

VII Score Shooting

1) Hunter rifle stocks must conform to the requirements established for the Heavy Varmint Rifle with the following additional requirements: 1) The maximum width is 2.250 inches and 2) Stocks must have a magazine area that

will meet the magazine requirements for Hunter Class rifles in VII C-8.

Stocks must be conventional hunting design and shape, not over 2.25 inches wide. Stocks of synthetic materials are allowed. Stocks to be convex on all bottom surfaces perpendicular to the barrel”

Add” Hunter rifle stocks must conform to the requirements established for the Heavy Varmint rifle with the following additional requirements: 1) The maximum width is 2.250 inches and 2) Stocks must have a magazine area that will meet the magazine requirement for Hunter Class Rifles in C-8.

Delete *Stocks must be conventional hunting design and shape, not over 2.25 inches wide. Stocks of synthetic materials are allowed. Stocks to be convex on all bottom surfaces perpendicular to the barrel”*

The convex bottom requirement is suggested dropped because many of the currently manufactured hunter rifle stocks have a flat bottom.

The Score committee recommends this rule change.

Score Shooting

B. Purpose

- a. 5) To attract shooters not previously engaged in Competitive Target Shooting
- 6) To improve hunting rifle accuracy and effects of components used therein
- 7) To better acquaint shooters with their rifles and competitive sportsmanship

B.Classifications

1) Hunter Class shall be fired with any cartridge with no less than 30-30 Win case capacity. This is accepted as 45 grains of water to the top of the neck. It shall be fired with a rifle meeting the rules described in Section VI.C

2) Varmint-Hunter Class shall be fired with any center fire cartridge. The rifle shall meet the rules as described in Section VI.C

3) Varmint For Score shall be fired with any rifle meeting the Light Varmint or Heavy Varmint rules as described Sections V.B.2 and V.B.3 of this rulebook. Records will be recognized for Light Varmint and Heavy Varmint Rifles but both rifles

shall compete as a single center fire class. Rimfire rifles shall compete as separate Light Varmint and Heavy Varmint classes. There shall be no distinction between Light Varmint and Sporter records. They shall be considered singly as a 10 1/2 pound class.

Reason for rule change:

To allow the HV and LV classes to compete separately would allow the clubs, IF THEY CHOOSE, to offer a LV/HV grand aggregate match. This format would provide the shooters more opportunities to compete as well as more revenue for the IBS and the local clubs from the additional match fees.

Proposed change to rule:

Under "Score Shooting B. classifications" change 3) to read, "**Varmint for Score** shall be fired with any rifle meeting the Light Varmint or Heavy Varmint rules as described Sections V.B.2 and V.B.3 of this rulebook. Records will be recognized for Light Varmint and Heavy Varmint Rifles and both rifles may compete as an individual class within the VFS class. Rimfire rifles shall compete as separate Light Varmint and Heavy Varmint classes. There shall be no distinction between Light Varmint and Sporter records. They shall be considered singly as a 10-1/2 pound class.

The Score Committee recommends this change if the agenda item wording remains unchanged

Establish Jr. Records in all IBS disciplines and classes beginning with the 2007 shooting season.

The Score Committee does not recommend this rule change. The Score Committee feels this agenda item needs to be reviewed by the various discipline Committees to determine if establishing Jr. Records is practical.

Item K Official Score Bulletins

The tournament sponsor shall supply every registered competitor with a copy of the official score bulletin which shall be a complete record of all groups fired, etc.

Agenda Item:

K. Competitor “may elect” to have results e-mailed to save club money or postage. If competitor does not elect e-mail of results, club will mail results.

The Score committee recommends this change as written if the emailed match reports are complete as described in the rulebook. Abbreviated reports are not acceptable.

Sc#7 thru SC#30 Rule changes, these agenda items were submitted by the IBS rule book committee. These agenda items are spelling corrections, clarifications, and general clean-up of rule book wording.

The Score Committee recommends the changes as written. The committee also recommends that these agenda items be voted on as a group rather than voting on each item.

G. Appointment of Tournament Officials

- 1) In all Registered Tournaments there shall be a Range Officer, three Referees, a Statistician, and an Official Scorer
- 2) All officials at Championship Tournaments must be approved by the President of IBS
- 3) No official, except Referees, shall participate as contestants in a Championship Tournament in which he/she is an official.
- 4) Referees must be IBS members in good standing

G. Appointment of Tournament Officials

1. In all Registered Tournaments there shall be a Range Officer, three Referees and an alternate, a Statistician, and an Official Scorer. The purpose of the alternate referee is to act in the place of any referee who is shooting and who requests one of his/her targets to be re-measured or plugged. No referee will, under any circumstance, judge their own target or targets.
2. All officials at Championship Tournaments must be approved by the President of IBS
3. No official, except Referees, shall participate as contestants in a Championship Tournament in which he/she is an official. At the discretion of the host IBS club, a Range Officer may shoot as long as he/she is not responsible for providing Range Officer supervision for a Match in which he/she is actually shooting.
4. Referees and alternates must be IBS members in good standing

SC#13:

AMENDED & PASSED

Current Rule:

I. Inspection of Equipment

- 1) A scale with official weights shall be set up near the firing line at all Registered Tournaments requiring weight limits on rifles. Competitors may use this equipment prior to and during the matches
- 2) The Referees shall inspect every rifle on the firing line, preferably as the competitors leave the firing line but at the Referees' discretion, during the firing of the matches
- 3) Referees will spot check at their discretion rifle weight dimensions and rests. Please cooperate. An overweight rifle, or one outside the rules dimensionally, or an illegal rest constitutes grounds for disqualification
- 4) Certified Master Weights are required at all Registered Tournaments. Scales should have a zeroing pointer. Scales must be balanced and leveled including the one-ounce error factor. Scales are to be set up in a reasonably permanent location and should remain at this location for the duration of the Tournament
- 5) In Tournament where the dimension factor is involved the Host Club shall provide an accurate scale, a steel rule, and a pair of calipers or micrometer having a maximum capacity in excess of 1.25". In weighing rifles with scope attached an excess of one ounce shall be attributed to scale error

Proposed Rule:

III Tournament Procedures

I. Inspection of Equipment

1. A scale with certified weights shall be set up near the firing line at all Registered Tournaments requiring weight limits on rifles. Competitors may use this equipment prior to and during the matches. A certified weight is one certified by a State Agency or a private company offering certified weights

2) The Referees shall inspect every rifle on the firing line at all State and National Championship Tournaments, preferably as the competitors leave the firing line but at the Referees' discretion, during the firing of the matches. At all registered IBS tournaments, referees will conduct random rifle weighings and will inspect rifles and rests to insure that rifles will be removable from their front rests without lifting any part of the front rest from its contact points with the bench it is occupying. These two checks are the minimum checks that must be done at all IBS Registered Tournaments. They may be performed before or after a Tournament begins.

3) Referees will spot check at their discretion rifle weight, dimensions and rests. Please cooperate. An overweight rifle, or one outside the rules dimensionally, or an illegal rest will result in disqualification if the illegal equipment has been used to fire any part of the Registered Tournament.

4) Acceptable scales are: a balance beam scale with a zeroing pointer and capable of ounce weight resolution; an electronic scale with a zeroing capability and with ounce weighing capability or in pounds and tenths of a pound. Scale must be leveled and are to be set up in a fixed location and should remain at this location for the duration of the Tournament.

5) In Tournament where the dimension factor is involved the Host Club shall provide an accurate scale, a steel rule, and a pair of calipers or micrometer having a maximum capacity in excess of 1.25". In weighing rifles with scope attached an excess of one ounce shall be attributed to scale error

Targets at all IBS registered Tournaments are to be displayed for viewing by competitors. Ranges are to provide protection of targets from the elements. This will allow competitors to protest inappropriately scored targets to Referees. Record targets will be hung as soon as they are scored and recorded. They will remain hanging for the duration of the yardage aggregate. Any shooter may ask for a target or targets to be re-measured or re-scored (Score Shoots) for matches one through 4 inclusive up until the match five (5) targets are displayed. After match five (5) targets are hung, 20 minutes will be allowed for any competitor to request a re-measure or re-score of their target from match five (5) only. At the end of this time, no requests for re-measure or re-score will be allowed. The host club will provide and utilize a timer, set for 30 minutes, and will activate the timer immediately after all match five (5) targets are hung.

No accommodation to flag position will be made otherwise unless the flag is in violation of this rule.

4) The use of electronic wind gauges or similar devices will be only allowed in Heavy Bench Rifle Competition
